In accordance with Guidelines established by the Office of the NH Attorney General, Charitable Trusts Unit, the Timber Framers Guild (EIN /81-4201896) enters into Pecuniary Benefit Transactions only in accordance with the applicable provisions of RSA 7:19-a. In our current fiscal year, which began on April 1, 2023, five of the Guild's 12 board members will be receiving pecuniary benefits. This is a change from the report that we submitted in April.

Three are teaching classes, one is managing a short course, and the last one is the editor of our journal. To inform the public of these payments, the notice below was published in the Keene Sentinel newspaper in August (see attached) and posted on the Guild's website.
